The Composite State Board of Medical Examiners shall administer All Rules and Regulations pertaining to administration. As hereinafter used, the term "Board" shall mean the Composite State Board of Medical Examiners. The administrative office for the Board is located at 2 Peachtree Street, NW, Atlanta, Georgia 30303.

**360-1-.01 Organization of Board. Amended.** The Composite State Board of Medical Examiners shall consist of twelve physicians and one consumer appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate. The Board shall elect a president and vice-president. The public may obtain information and submit requests at the office of the Board. Board minutes shall not become official until approved by the Board.

**360-1-.02 Executive Director.** The Board may appoint by a two-thirds majority vote a person to serve as Executive Director of the Board.

(a) The Executive Director shall be vested with the following powers:

1. To carry out investigations and to hire investigators for the purpose of conducting investigations;

2. To hire such personnel as the Board deems necessary to carry out its functions and appoint professionally qualified persons to serve as members of peer review committees;

3. Under the direction of the Board, to aid in the enforcement of Chapter 34 of Title 43 and in the prosecution of all persons charged with violations of its provisions;

4. To make, or cause to be made through employees or agents of the Board, such investigations as the Board may deem necessary or advisable in the enforcement of Chapter 34 of Title 43;

5. To issue subpoenas, to compel access to documents or other materials that the President of the Board, or the Vice-President if the President is not available, deems related to the fitness of any licensee or applicant to practice;

6. To authorize the issuance of notices of hearing by the Attorney General on behalf of the Board; and

7. The powers, duties, and functions granted to the joint-secretary of the state examining boards under Chapter 1 of Title 43.
