RULES COMMITTEE

Dr. Wiltz presented the report of the Rules Committee that met on May 2, 2002. Dr. Summers moved to approve the recommendations, Dr. Kumar seconded and it carried unanimously. The recommendations were:

Dr. Summers moved that in the case of Mark Stallman, M.D. to uphold the Initial Decision delivered by the Administrative Law Judge with the effective date of license suspension no later than ten (10) days after docketing of the Final Order to be before June 5, 2002, Dr. Kumar seconded and it carried unanimously.
